The Sorris Sorris Hiking Safari Itinerary

Arrival and Briefing

Guests will arrive at Madisa Camp from 14h00 onwards
Accommodation for the first night is provided. Beers, ciders, wines and soft drinks are not included and will be for hiker's own account. Drinking water will be provided to hikers for the duration of the hike. Vehicles will be parked in an area allocated by Madisa and will remain here for the duration of the hike.

18h00 Briefing session with WWS team, and a delicious hot dinner is served

Day 1 and 2:

05h30 Wakeup call and luggage to be handed over to logistics team for packing. Guests will only be carrying their day backpack.

06h00 Coffee and rusks. Brunch will be served along the route.

06h30 Hikers start hiking trail (+/- 20 km)

Day 2 will consist of crossing a large dune field, heading towards the majestic Brandberg.

Day 3 will consist of dune sand turning into harder gravel heading towards the Ugab River. Hikers will arrive at a wild camp with tents, toilets, showers and dining area.

Day 3:

05h30 Wakeup call and luggage to be handed over to logistics team for packing. Guests will only be carrying their day backpack.

06h00 Breakfast is served

06h30 Hiking trail (+/- 20 km) Day 3 Hike will be along the Ugab River towards Sorris Sorris/ Anixab. Hikers will arrive at a wild camp located in the Ugab river between the koppies, accommodation tents, toilets, showers and dining area.

Day 4

05h30 Hikers start hiking trail (+/- 20 km) Day 4 Hike will be along the Ugab River. Hikers will be transported back to Madisa Camp to their vehicles. Overnight at Madisa Camp provided
